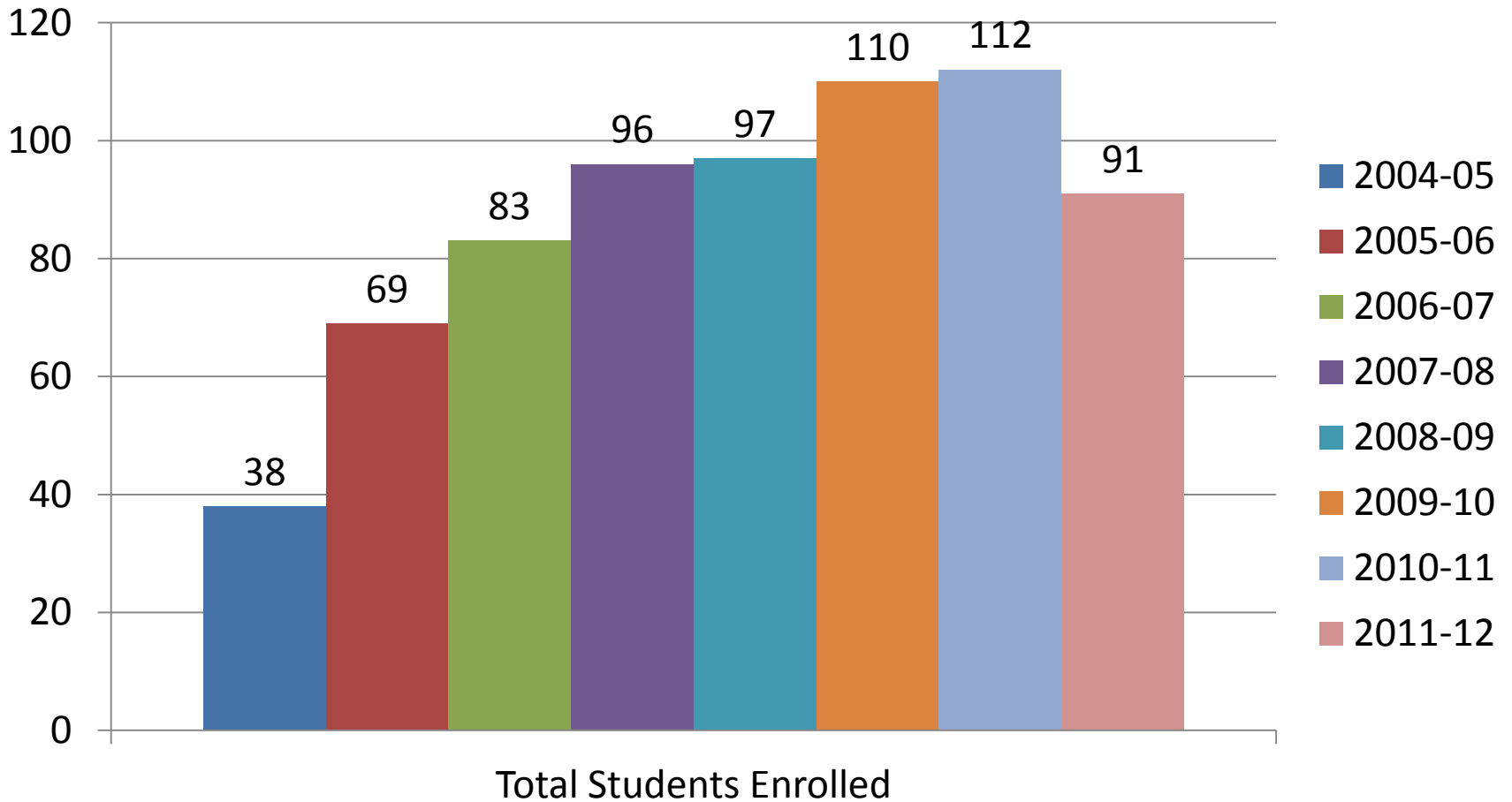

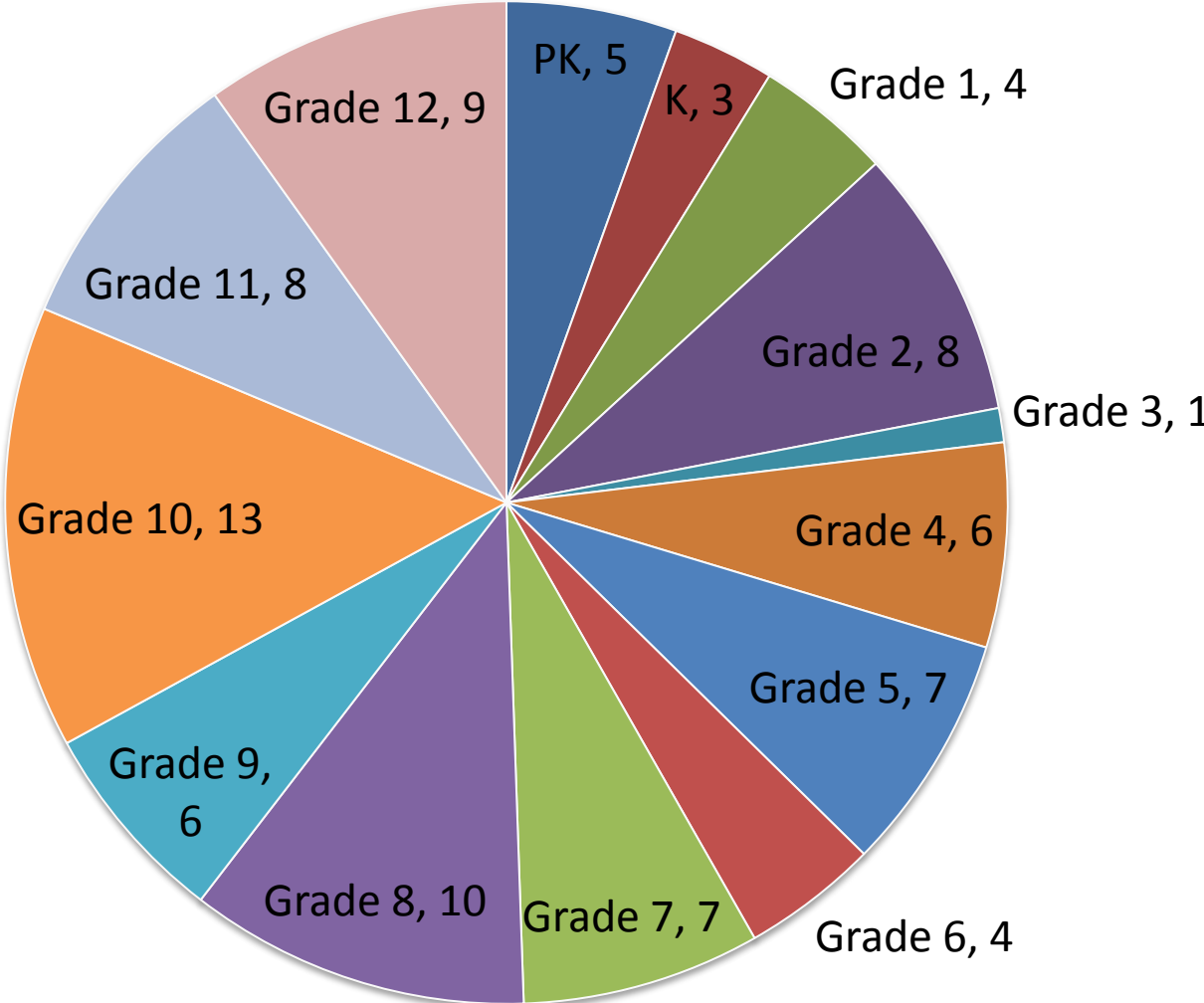

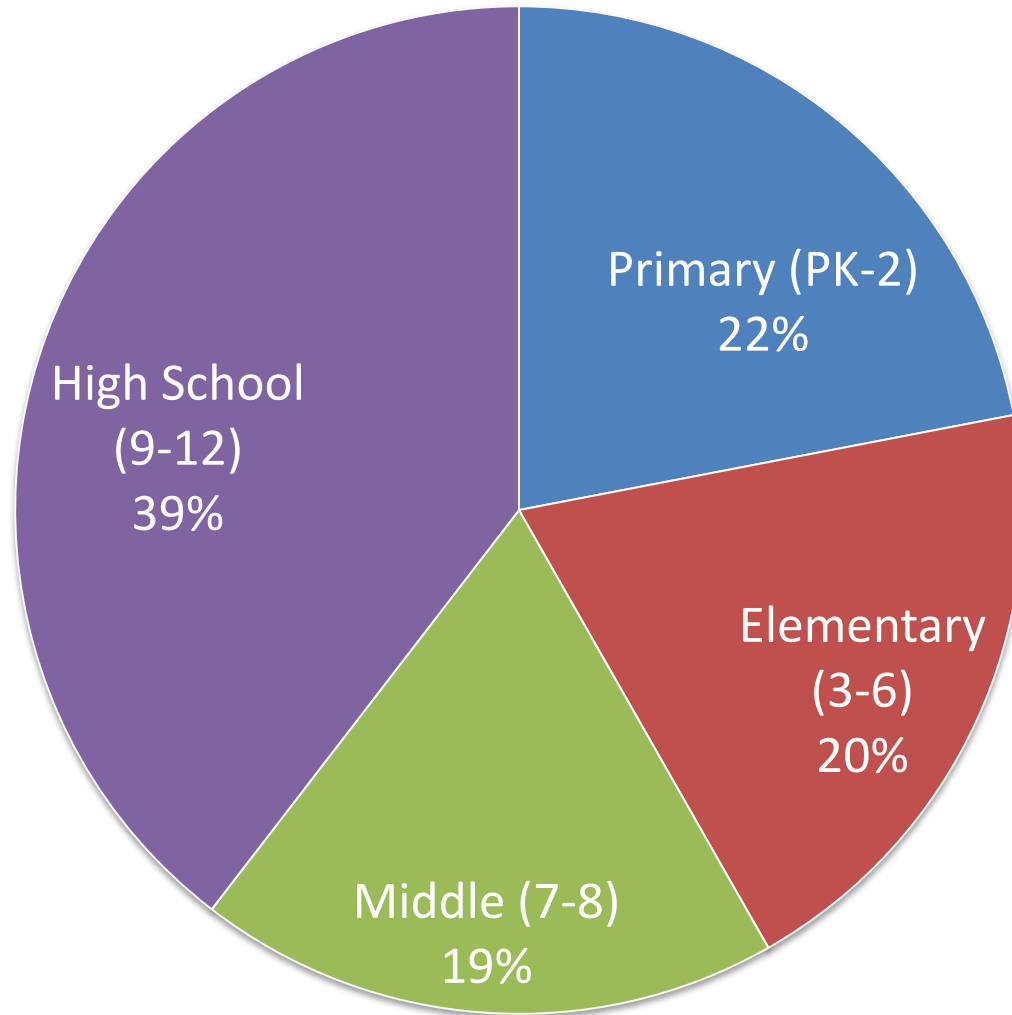
Norwin Total Enrollment in Cyber Schools



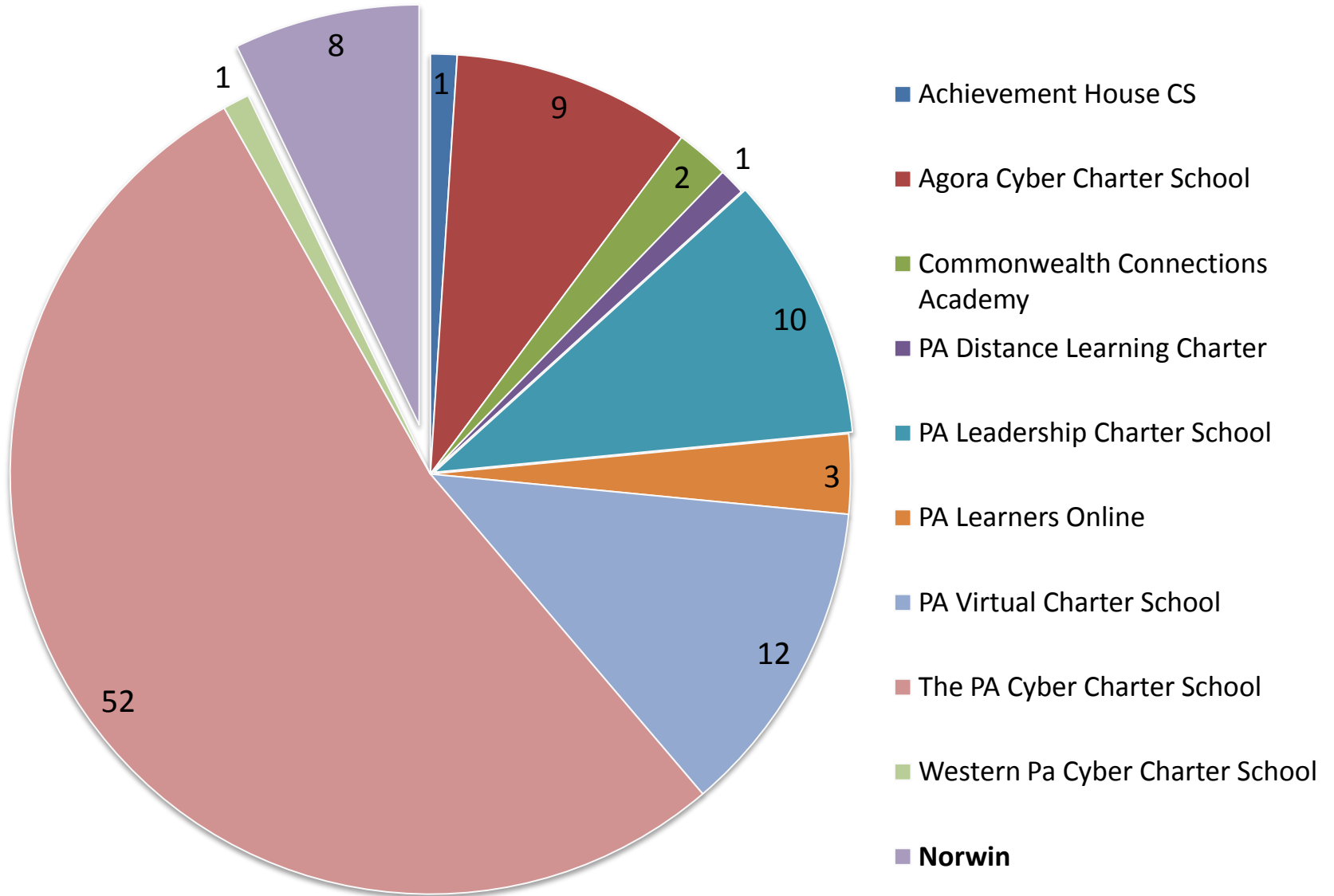
2011-12 Cyber School Enrollment by Grade



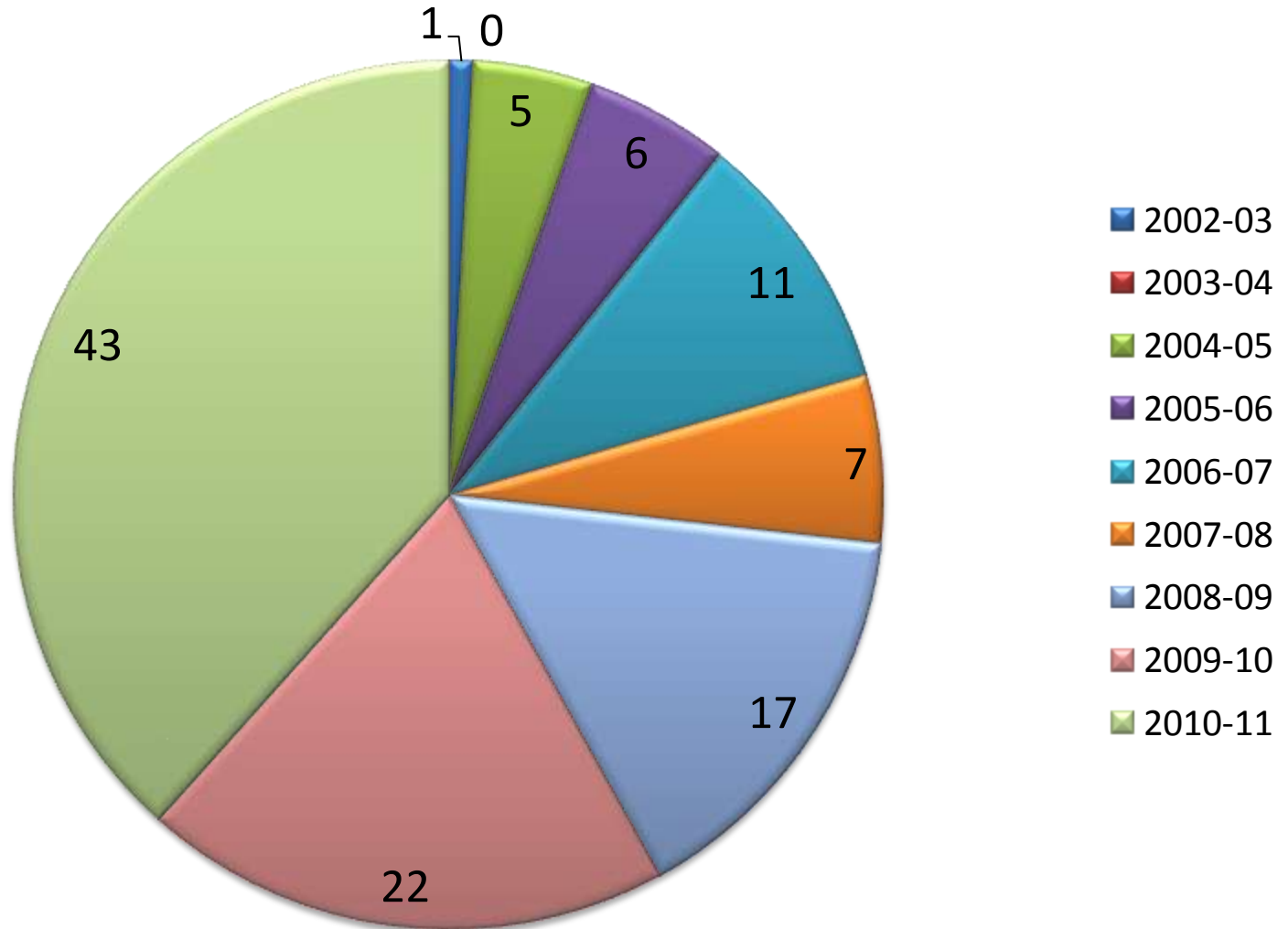
2011-12 Cyber School Enrollment by Grade Spans

School Year 2010-11 New Students Enrolled in Cyber-School Annually





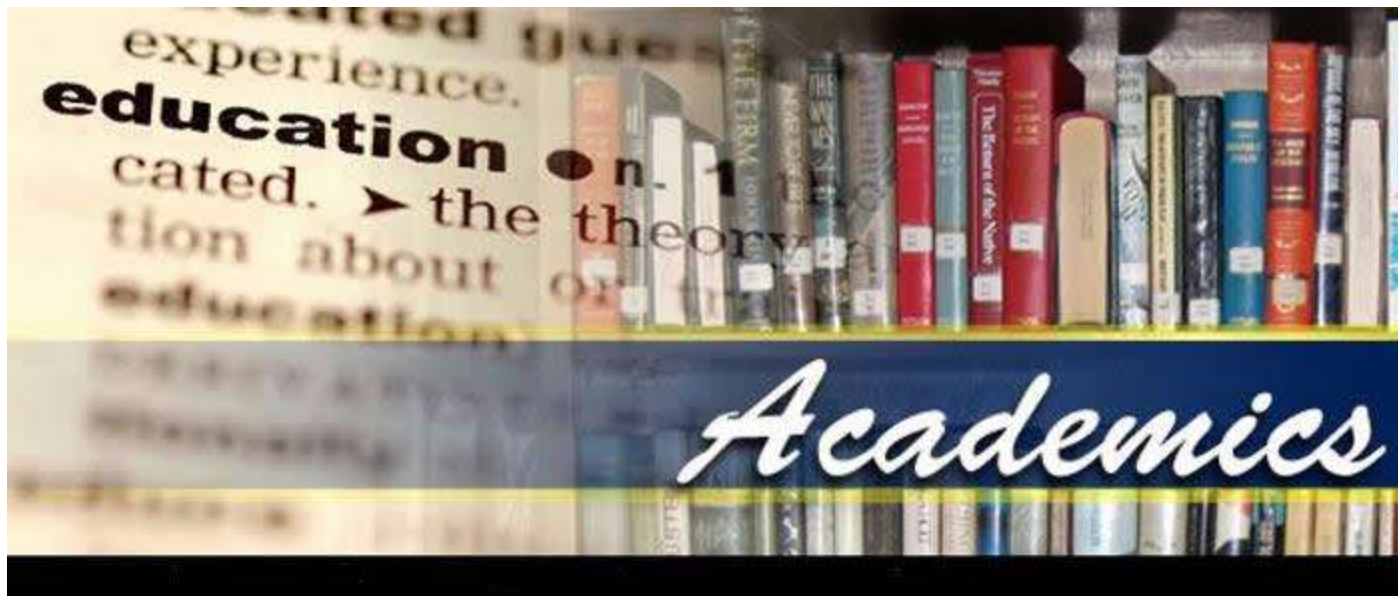

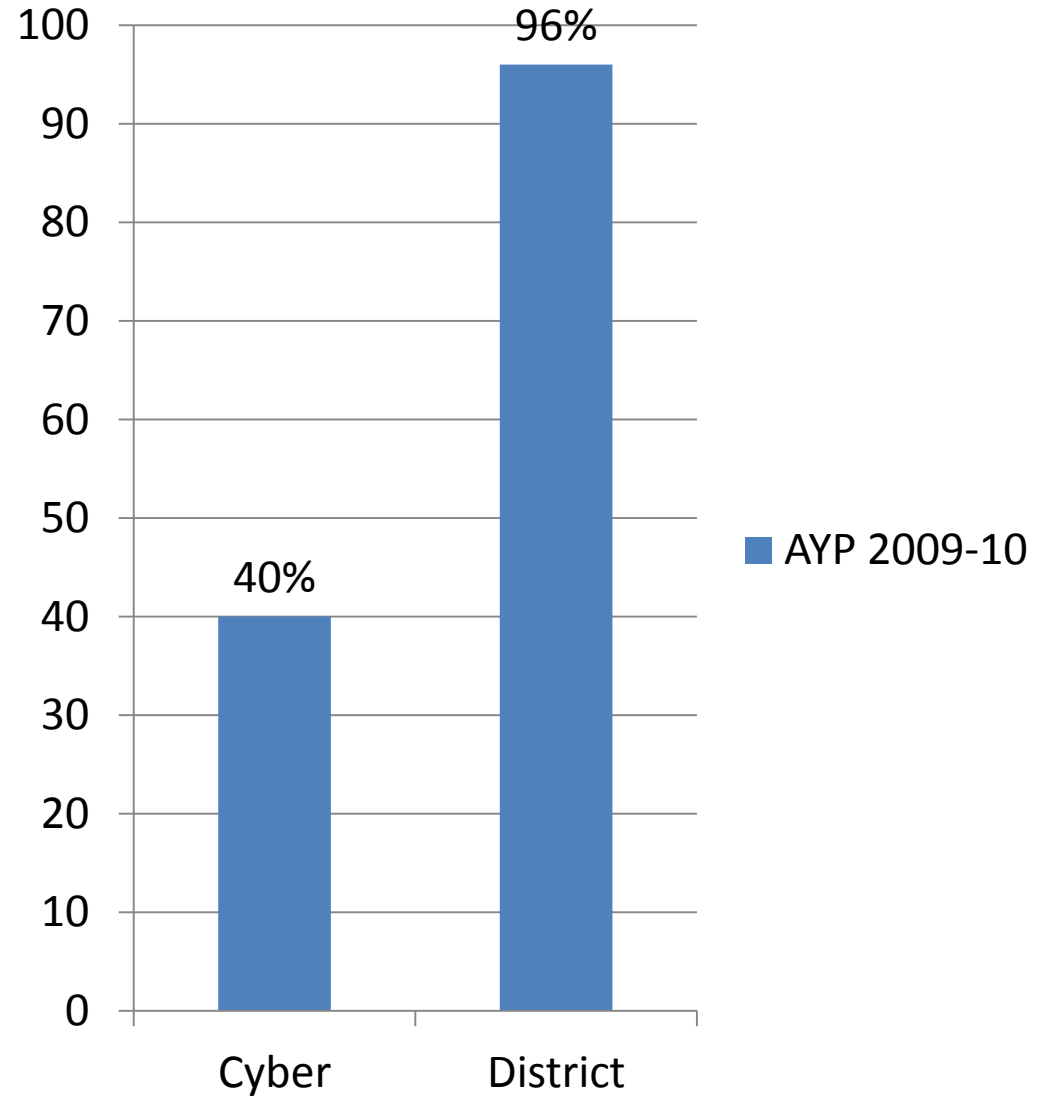
Adequate Yearly Progress

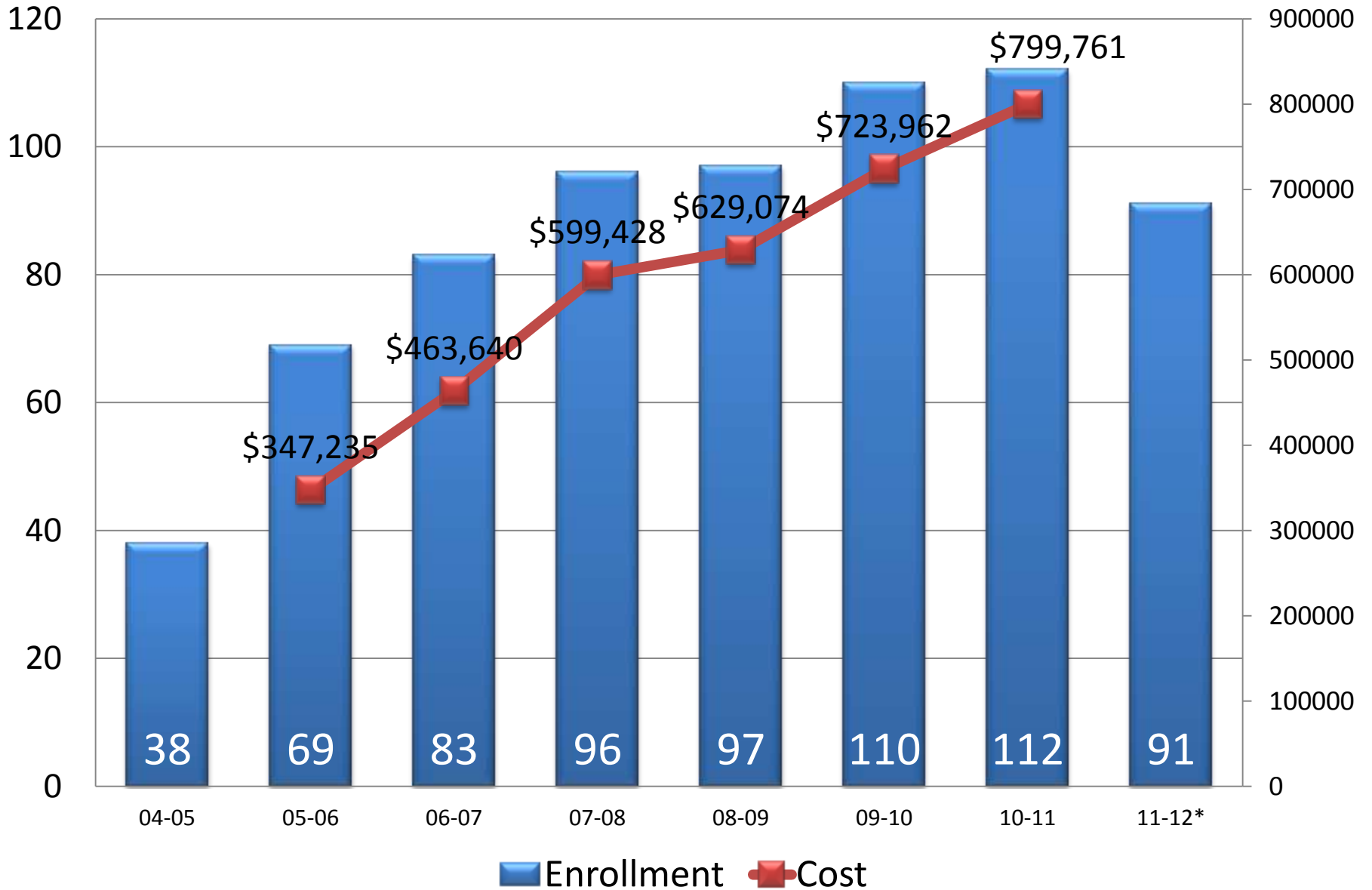

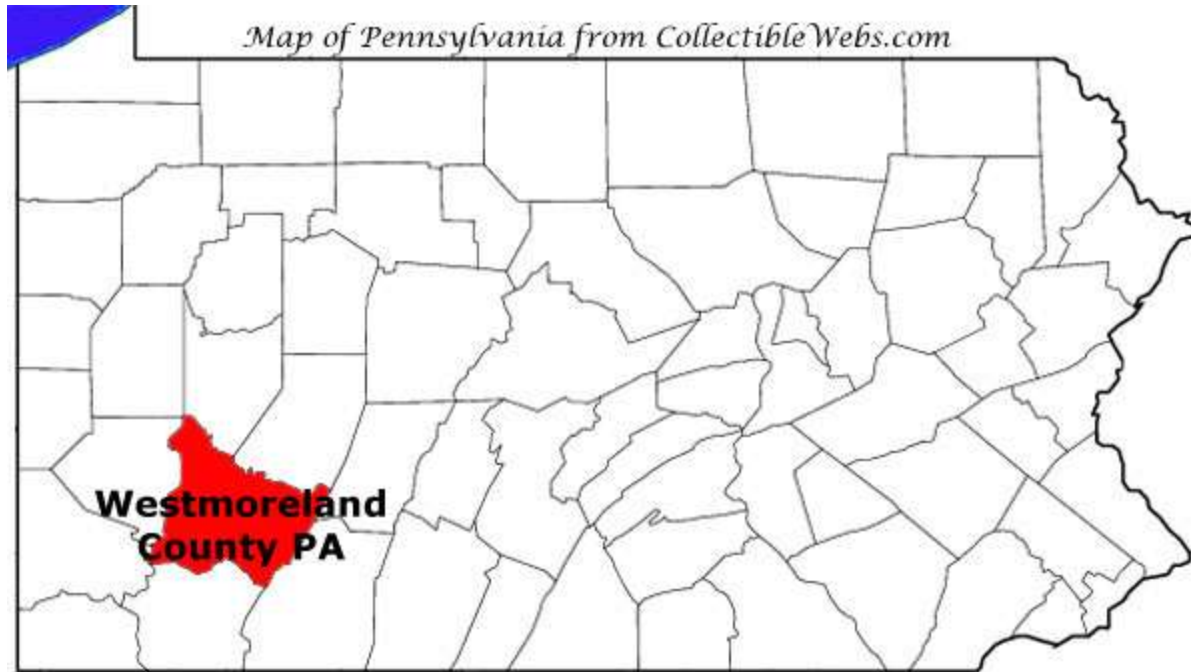

WESTMORELAND COUNTY CYBER DATA

What is Cyber School Costing Your District?

"Westmoreland School District" has 75 students currently enrolled in cyber charter schools. This costs the district \$8,000 for every regular education student, and \$14,500 for every special education student. The examples below show the potential savings to Westmoreland School District with the WUAcademy program.

No Cyber Option

The school district does not have a cyber solution; any student who would like flexible scheduling or online courses must enroll in a cyber charter school.

65 Regular Education Students @\$8,000 each	\$520,000
10 Special Education Students @\$14,500 each	\$145,000
Total Cost to District	\$665,000

\$0 Savings

eAcademy Plus Shared Courses

The school district utilizes the shared teacher resources of the consortium and does not have any online courses built into the traditional school day.

6 courses/student @ \$250 each for 75 students	\$112,500
Laptops and Internet access for 1 year @ \$750 each	\$48,750
eAcademy Membership	\$16,000

Total Cost to District
\$177,250

\$487,750 Savings

Potential Savings Per Student:
Regular Ed: \$5,750
Special Ed Student: \$12,250

eAcademy With Full Integration

The school district is able to offer the majority of their courses online as an integrated part of the district's daily schedule.

6 courses/student	\$0
Laptops and Internet access for 1 year	\$48,750
eAcademy Membership	\$16,000

Total Cost to District
\$64,750

\$600,250 Savings

Potential Savings Per Student:
Regular Ed: \$7,250
Special Ed Student: \$13,750

Norwin Cyber Stats 2011

- 8 students
 - 2 Hybrid
 - 6 Full Cyber
- Cost Avoidance
 - 3 special education
 - \$40,500
 - 4 retained from leaving
 - \$24,000
 - 1 back from cyber
 - \$8,000
